

Why The Voice Of **MARSHA RANDOLPH-JACKSON**

Dedicated to females in leadership, the DTJ Guild Luncheon recognizes a Central Florida resident whose passion, work, and example speak highly of her, and make her outstanding in the community. Each year's honoree is presented with our "A Woman's Voice" Award and is, in turn, invited to deliver ten minutes of commentary on the theme of "What I Have To Say" as a response. Our 2018 luncheon honoree and recipient of this year's award is artist and business professional **MARSHA JACKSON-RANDOLPH**

Marsha Jackson Randolph is living the life to which she has been called. Our honoree brought extensive professional experiences to Walt Disney World Resort when she joined the company in 2006 to take on the role of **Show Director for Disney Parks Live Entertainment**. Ms. Jackson-Randolph had performed abroad and nationally beforehand; she made her Broadway debut in 1988, in the play *Checkmates* with co-stars Denzel Washington, Ruby Dee, and Paul Winfield. She was Co-founder and Artistic Director of Jomandi Productions, an Atlanta theatre known for producing new work and feature appearances off-Broadway and at Lincoln Center, and had earned renown as a playwright of numerous works, including "*Sisters*" (presented by The Joyce Theatre with support from the NBC New Voices Program). Always an advocate for regional theatre, Ms. Jackson-Randolph served as a program reviewer with the National Endowment for the Arts for more than a decade. With Disney she has directed an array of projects, including *The Lion King Concert in the Wild* - a Disney Parks salute to the 20th anniversary of the film - featuring Viola Davis and other greats. She has overseen and directed the *Disney Dreamers Academy* with Steve Harvey and Essence Magazine (an annual motivational program for high school age youth) since its inception in 2008. Ms. Jackson-Randolph is an active member and youth ministries leader at Macedonia Missionary Baptist Church in Eatonville. Her most fulfilling role is as mother to Aaron James Randolph, an emerging artist in his own right.
